[Ambush Attacks Against Law Enforcement: Safety and Prevention Strategies](#)

On May 15, 2017, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) released the 2016 preliminary statistics for Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the line of duty. These statistics show that 66 law enforcement officers were feloniously killed in the line of duty and that 17 of these officers were killed in ambush attacks. Ambush attacks also were responsible for multiple serious injuries to officers and others. This article will provide strategies to prevent ambush attacks and keep officers safe if attacked.

[The FBI Releases 2016 Preliminary Statistics for Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty](#)

Preliminary statistics released today by the FBI show that 66 law enforcement officers were feloniously killed in the line of duty in 2016. This is an increase of 61 percent over the 41 officers killed in 2015. By region, 30 officers died as a result of criminal acts that occurred in the South, 17 officers in the West, 13 officers in the Midwest, 4 in the Northeast, and 2 in Puerto Rico. [Read more](#)

[Casualty Care—Get Off the X](#)

This online scenario is designed to increase the capacity of law enforcement personnel to implement mitigation techniques for major hemorrhage secondary to gunshot and/or knife wounds, etc. This mock law enforcement officers/suspect scenario deals with a fairly common law enforcement incident, a felony vehicular stop. The scenario reinforces tactics that should be utilized to mitigate injuries associated with gunfire from a suspect or suspects. At the conclusion of this scenario, participants will understand the importance of suppressing the threat, using cover and concealment for protection, and treating life-threatening bleeding as the first medical priority.
