Program to Save Woman

Jacksonville police officers responded to a domestic violence call at a mobile home park and found a 30-year-old woman with several deep cuts to her arm and a lot of blood. The officers applied a tourniquet received through the U.S. Department of Defense's Law Enforcement Support Office (1033) program to save the woman's life. The Jacksonville police officers received 75 combat tourniquets through this program. Read more

Police Chief Credits Bullet-Resistant Vest With Saving Officer's Life

Officer Kyle Carroll from the Louisville Metro Police Department was released from the hospital after being shot at close range. Louisville Metro Police Chief Steve Conrad stated, "This situation is truly a testimony to our officers wearing their bullet-resistant vests. This was a situation where the shot was fired from relatively close range. The officer reacted and tried to get out of the way of the shot and ended up getting struck in the upper left chest."
